Transformation Funding for Frailty: CCG have proposed a significant invest over 3-years (£3m-£5m pa) to support primary care and community services to implement frailty strategy – the funding will enable “double-running” so development of community based services are not dependent on savings from the acute / secondary care sector. Providers need to pull together proposals. Chris Mills commented there was a commitment to resource the third sector as part of this funding. LPICC had discussed some of the common barriers to change – data sharing, MOUs, recruitment etc etc and requested regular feedback in order to resolve any problems.<li data-bbox="699 1025 1415 1429">2. NHS Long Term Plan: General discussion re CCG move towards high level population health management resource allocation and citizen engagement – not as involved in operational detail. Providers will collaborate to deliver new models of services. Discussed the role of PPB and agreement that PPB provides the main forum for providers to develop collaborative approaches. Jim Barwick will prepare a proposal about the future role of PPB in the new NHS context. .<li data-bbox="699 1503 1415 1944">3. Key Fund: presentation by Karen Hobson. Social investment funding to support improved health / access to services or support. Provide grant / loan funding. Example funded Bramley Baths. Karen has made contact with Forum Central. PPB agreed they had role as leaders in the system to encourage innovation through social investment funding. Also provoked a discussion about importance of measuring the social benefits of services not just financial, impact on health services.
