<b>Key Issues / Themes / Messages</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Positive feedback on the impact and learning from Shadow PEG. A second cohort of Shadow PEG will run from October – a third sector rep will be needed to be part of Shadow PEG</li><li>2. Population Health Management – making good progress in 4 Local Care Partnerships identified as pilot sites. Further update in June. Sessions running to provide more information to wider groups as model can be rolled out more widely.</li><li>3. Obsessions for Leeds Health and Care Plan discussed further. Key areas:<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Reducing inequalities through better prevention</li><li>• Place of care being someone’s home / community / Promoting independence</li><li>• Good mental health</li></ul></li><li>4. Round table discussion with Prerana Isser, Chief People Officer NHSE<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• launched the Academy based around four themes: Attracting and retaining our future workforce; Improving working lives; Improving systems working; and Improving working partnerships</li><li>• Examples of recent successes including one induction video for all partners; 2 day system leadership programme; bringing together MH networks; bringing together women’s networks; launch of state of women’s health report; medical students holding events in city to show public how to restart a heart.</li></ul></li></ol>
