Key Issues / Themes / Messages	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. One-off non-recurrent ICS monies discussed in private session with allocation of £1.4mn for MH/LD and autism. 0.9mn potentially for “place” and VCS though potential priorities not specified. We all made the point that without knowing the plans of ICS and understanding bigger picture, it was impossible to agree these sums in isolation. Sara Munro gave examples of previous ICS MH spend in CAMHS and how the £1.4mn would also fund a transitions MH service. 2. Open Forum – Change spoke from the audience on how services do not include LD as part of mainstream commissioning or delivery. This was a powerful and timely challenge on the system and all the statutory sector members committed to meeting Philipa and members to discuss how to stop this exclusion and deliver an “Inclusion Revolution”. Really pleased I facilitated this as part of Forum Central’s pledge to support smaller members in 2019/20. 3. WY and Harrogate 5 Year Strategy: The vision of the Strategy is to be a partnership with VCS, Local Govt, Health and Social Care across WY&H. The WY&H ICS has no statutory powers but is a servant of “place”. The strategy will be linked to this and the NHS Long-term plan. The Leeds Plan refresh was also raised under this item and the linkages explained, as well as the differences, i.e. the Leeds Plan is our H&WB Strategy delivery tool, not the way we will deliver the ICS, though there are also linkages. 4. State of Women’s Health Report, tabled and questions answered. This is the first report of its kind ever and is a “call to arms” to the “system” to respond. All members to have as agenda items in the year and will pull out some shared priorities to action across the system.
